

SKYTEAM Livery Fact Sheet

The SkyTeam livery serves as a symbol of each member airline's commitment not only to the alliance, but to delivering high-quality service to its customers. While all member airlines carry their own identity, SkyTeam's "Caring More About You" philosophy remains consistent throughout its members, and the unified SkyTeam livery serves as further proof of this consistency.

UNIFIED SKYTEAM LIVERY

Created by Brandimage – Desgrappes & Laga, the SkyTeam livery design was inspired by the alliance's logo, which aims to express the ideals of both strength and service through a ribbon graphic. The livery design features:

- The dark blue SkyTeam logo on the tail fin
- The blue SkyTeam ribbon wrapped around the back portion of the fuselage, which is a silver color
- The SkyTeam name in large, dark blue letters along the front side of the aircraft fuselage
- The name of the operating carrier placed below the SkyTeam name on the front section of the aircraft fuselage

TIMELINE

Delta Air Lines was the first SkyTeam member to showcase an airplane with the new SkyTeam livery. On 31 March 2009, the B767-400 aircraft departed Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport to Milan's Malpensa Airport.

The SkyTeam fleet will have a total of nine planes showcasing the livery by 2009:

SKYTEAM LIVERY BY THE NUMBERS

- 9 number of planes expected to be added to the SkyTeam fleet by the end of 2009
- 10 average number of days it takes to paint a plane
- 3 number of coats of paint on a plane – a base coat, the color, and a clear top coat
- 265 number of liters of paint to cover Delta's 767-400
 - 151.5 liters of silver mica for the fuselage
 - 75.7 liters of gray paint for the wings
 - 37.85 liters of dark blue paint for the ribbon and SkyTeam logo

*Since Continental Airlines plans to leave the SkyTeam Alliance in October 2009, Continental will not paint an aircraft with the SkyTeam livery.
