

Methodology

14,004 adults were interviewed by telephone between 18 June and 16 July 2014 in the following constituencies:

Amber Valley (1,000: 3 – 12 July)
Broxtowe (1,000: 26 June – 4 July)
Cardiff North (1,000: 18 – 27 June)
Hendon (1,001: 18 – 29 June)
Great Yarmouth (1,000: 11 – 16 July 2014)
Lancaster & Fleetwood (1,000: 26 June – 4 July)
Morecambe & Lunesdale (1,001: 7 – 11 July)
North Warwickshire (1000: 18 – 28 June)
Thanet South (1,000: 11 – 16 July)
Thurrock (1,002: 18 – 26 June)
Sherwood (1,000: 26 June – 4 July)
Stockton South (1,000: 26 June – 4 July)
Waveney (1,000: 7 – 12 July)
Wolverhampton South West (1,000: 7 – 11 July)

For each constituency, results were weighted to be representative of all adults living in the constituency. Results are weighted by recalled past vote at the last general election and stated likelihood to turn out at the next. A proportion of those who don't know or refuse to say how they will vote are re-allocated to the party they voted for at the 2010 general election. Full data tables are available at www.LordAshcroftPolls.com.

The 12 most marginal Conservative-held seats with Labour in second place were selected. In addition, Great Yarmouth and Thanet South were selected as examples of Conservative-Labour marginals in which UKIP are expected to have a strong presence.

These seats were previously polled between 31 March and 27 April 2014.
