

Methodology

5,001 adults were interviewed by telephone between 5 and 22 June 2014 in the following constituencies:

Bradford East (1,000: 11 – 21 June)

Brent Central (1,001: 11 – 22 June)

Brighton Pavilion (1,000: 5 – 12 June)

Norwich South (1,000: 11 – 21 June)

Manchester Withington (1,000: 11 – 21 June)

For each constituency, results were weighted to be representative of all adults living in the constituency. Results are weighted by recalled past vote at the last general election and stated likelihood to turn out at the next. A proportion of those who don't know or refuse to say how they will vote are re-allocated to the party they voted for at the 2010 general election. Four Liberal Democrat-held seats were selected in order of marginality. Green-held Brighton Pavilion was also included as an additional seat in which Labour would compete closely with the Liberal Democrats. This seat has been excluded from the aggregate battleground results.
